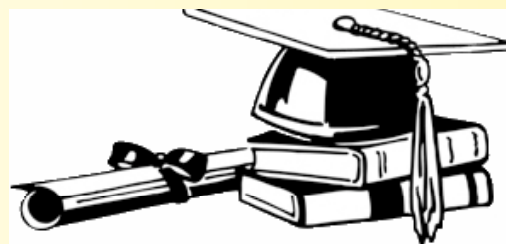


Some of my favorite memories of growing up were fishing at the Home's pond. We still have the pond and our kids still fish in it today. Our children and houseparents use the pond as a

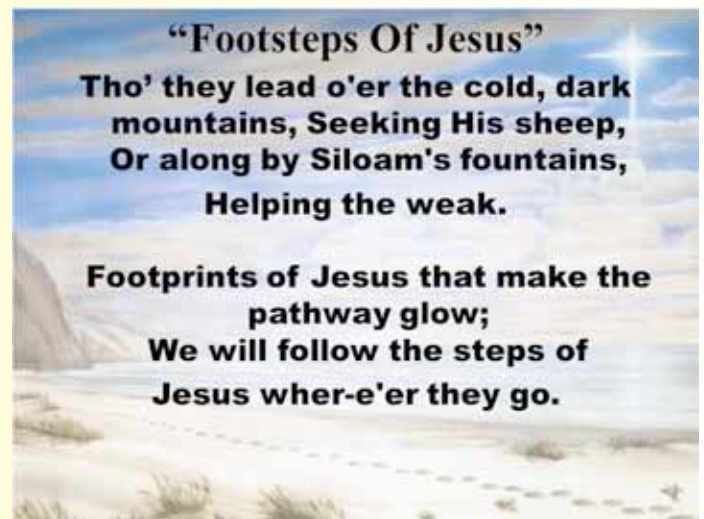
How humbling! The greatness of this one solitary man exceeds everything. There is nothing we can do or say that will mimic the magnitude of his short stay on earth.
