Below are five things I believe that we and all of our children need to do to find that peace.

1. Try to Plan a Peace conference.... Matthew 5:24 We all need to take the initiative and try to make peace with those that have hurt us in the past. Yes, it is difficult and might cause hardship but it will be worth it.
2. Empathize.... This one is so hard. But we need to put ourselves in the other person's shoes. We try to teach our children to do the same thing. Consider the other person's feelings.
3. Attack....Yes attack the problem, not the person. When we get in a disagreement we often end up attacking the person. If we can attack the problem only it will make peace easier to attain. For our children here at the Home, this one is very hard because the problem is often times the person. However, if we can teach them to really focus on the problem and not make it personal it can and will help.
4. Cooperate as much as possible. Romans 12:18 If it is possible as far as it depends on you live at peace with everyone. Enough said.
5. Emphasize reconciliation, not resolution. Reconciliation focuses on the relationship. The resolution focuses on the problem. When you focus on A....B becomes insignificant.

My brother's wheelchair has fallen over and I can not set it back up by myself." The man looked around the corner and there was the boy's brother who had indeed fallen over. He helped him up and pushed him onto the sidewalk so the boys could return to their home. The man returned to his car. He looked at the dent in his new car but decided that he would leave the dent as a reminder of the day. In essence, "Don't go through life so fast that someone has to throw a brick at you to get your attention."

## *Tipton Children's Home Recipe of the Quarter*



Tipton Children's Home cafeteria was opened in 1965 under the direction of T. N. Putnam. Billy Gray became manager of the cafeteria followed by Joe Waugh, Charles and Anita Davis and the present manager, Alan Boyd. One of the most requested recipes is the homemade hamburger buns. We are sharing the recipe today for all of you who have requested it. I hope you enjoy having the recipe and they make your hamburgers delicious.

### **Tipton Children's Home Hamburger Bun Recipe**

1 cup Crisco, not melted	1/2 cup sugar
1 cup boiling water	1 1/2 tsp. salt
1 cup warm water	2 pkgs. yeast
6-7 cups flour	

Pour boiling water over Crisco, sugar and salt, blend and allow to cool.

Let yeast stand in warm water for 5 minutes. Stir and add to water mixture.

Add flour and blend well.

Let rise to double in size, then punch it down. Let rise again, then roll out and butter (melted) half the dough. Fold over and cut to desired bun size. Let buns rise on the pans.

Bake at 400 degrees until brown.
